



## LEADERSHIP QUEST Fact Sheet

**What:** Leadership Quest is a seven-day wilderness camp experience for high school students that develops skills in Christ-centeredness, leadership, discipleship, community, dreaming, visioning, planning, and confidence and equips students to make a positive difference in their families, schools, churches and communities. Leadership Quest 2 is the new follow up to LQ. It focuses on advanced Bible study methods, more leadership skills, relational ministry skills and honing students understanding of their worldview. All programming is led by Tentmaker-trained adult leaders and provides the same high standard of quality that Tentmakers training is known for. A small camp size (maximum of 35 students and 10 adult leaders) creates more opportunity for individual growth and encouragement. Quite often mentors, adults who have a wealth of knowledge and life experience, are part of the camp week too.

**Who:** Responsible high school students who have completed at least their freshman year of high school and possess leadership qualities and a desire to deepen their faith. At least one adult leader for every six students is encouraged to attend (does not have to be a youth pastor/director).

**Where:** Wilderness North is a beautiful, rustic training facility located 50 miles north of Duluth, Minnesota, in the heart of the Superior National Forest on scenic Lake Murphy (see Wilderness North info below).

**When: Leadership Quest Dates 2012 – Bold Dates are both LQ and LQ 2**

**Registration:** To register, print the Group Registration Form the [www.tentm.org](http://www.tentm.org) website, complete, and send to the Tentmakers office. A \$100 non-refundable registration deposit is needed for each youth and adult participant. Payment can be mailed with your registration form or you can pay online. See our web page to pay online. Then complete a Participant List, also on the web site, to put individual names and contact information of those in your group,. Here are the rates:

Super Early Bird Registration Deadline: \$330 (LQ), \$345 (LQ 2) per student postmarked by Dec 7, 2011

Early Bird Registration Deadline: \$365 (LQ), \$380 (LQ 2) per student postmarked by February 29, 2012

Regular Registration: \$395 (LQ), \$410(LQ 2) per student postmarked after February 29, 2012 or later

Adult Registration: \$225

Registration Deposit: \$100 non-refundable deposit with all student and adult registrations

Balance of all camp fees is due three weeks before your actual week of Leadership Quest.

No camp fees will be refunded within three weeks of your week of Leadership Quest.

There is a scholarship fund. Please have students mail a letter (or email) to Laura Praske, stating why they want to come to LQ and their financial need.

Families are welcome! Spouse rate is \$125, children 6 and up are \$90, children 5 and under are free.

**Wilderness North:** Secluded on 1500 acres of wooded lakeshore, Wilderness North is a unique setting for Leadership Quest and for those seeking to be “set apart” for a time from the noise and busyness of culture. Wilderness North is located on the shores of Lake Murphy in the middle of the Superior National Forest in northern Minnesota. The wilderness experience provides an opportunity for all students and adults to be on the same level and away from their usual environment. All share in the rustic experience and the daily operation of the camp. Participants sleep in two person tents (on raised platforms) in a wooded area of birch and pine trees. A lodge is equipped with a kitchen, dining area, and meeting areas to meet participants’ needs. Families stay in family tents. Lake Murphy is a quiet private lake that provides plenty of water fun—swimming, canoeing, kayaking, sail boating, and fishing. Visitors can hike miles of trails, play sand volleyball, sit in the screened in gazebo, or enjoy the two campfire areas. Wilderness North has been known as a place for people to “wrestle” with God and explore their own hearts and minds as Jacob did in Genesis 32:2.
